

ATTACHMENT 16**THE POSITIONING OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS.**

The complainant did approach a number of international organisations on the subject of the Swiss foreign national rotation policy¹ only to find out that no International organisation would be prepared to take a case by an individual against Switzerland up. This was particularly true² for International organisations that have their seats in Switzerland and are dependent on the goodwill, licences, Work& residence permits for their incoming personnel, security and services of that country.

The answers by the **WTO** World Trade Organisation and subsequently the **ILO**= International Labour Office and the BIS Bank for International settlements are to be found below.
